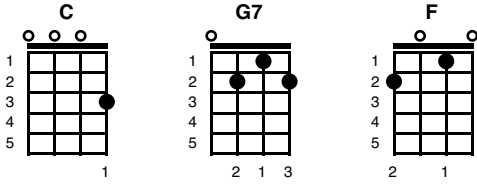


Let's Talk Dirty in Hawaiian
